Trained volunteers canvassed Fredericton and found that at least **50** individuals were experiencing absolute homelessness* on the night of February 21st.

Most Commonly Identified Reasons for Housing Loss




Reason for Housing Loss: 36% Family Conflict & Domestic Abuse



Gender Breakdown: Male 71% Female 26% Declined to Answer 3%



Identified as aboriginal or as having aboriginal ancestry: 18%





Identified as Chronically Homeless: 65%

Chronically homeless refers to 6 months or more of homelessness in a 12 month period



Identified as Episodically Homeless:

24% Episodic homelessness refers to 3x or more being homeless in a 12 month period

The Point-in-Time (PiT) Count is a strategy to help determine the extent of homelessness in a community at a single point in time. PiT Counts allow a community to better understand the nature of homelessness and the demographics of the homeless population. Conducting a PiT Count is a first step in creating future measures towards reducing homelessness.

*Absolute homelessness includes only those living on the street, in emergency shelters or in transitional housing
