




- The First Nations peoples are the original inhabitants of Canada, defined by the Constitution Act of 1982.*
- There are 977,235 First Nations peoples in Canada from coast-to-coast
- The Métis are the descendants
 The Inuit are the Indigenous of Aboriginal peoples and 18th century European fur traders.
 The Inuit are the Indigenous peoples of the Arctic, stretch across Canada, Russia,
- There are 587,545 Métis in Canada, most commonly in the
 Prairie provinces, Ontario, British Columbia, and the North West Territories.



According to the 2016 Census, 1.9% of residents in the Saint John CMA identified having indigenous identity, compared to 4.0% in New Brunswick and 4.9% in Canada.

The average age of Indigenous peoples in Canada is 32.1 years old, compared to non-Indigenous Canadians who are on average 40.9 years old.




In New Brunswick...

6,391 First Nations people live off reserve.


