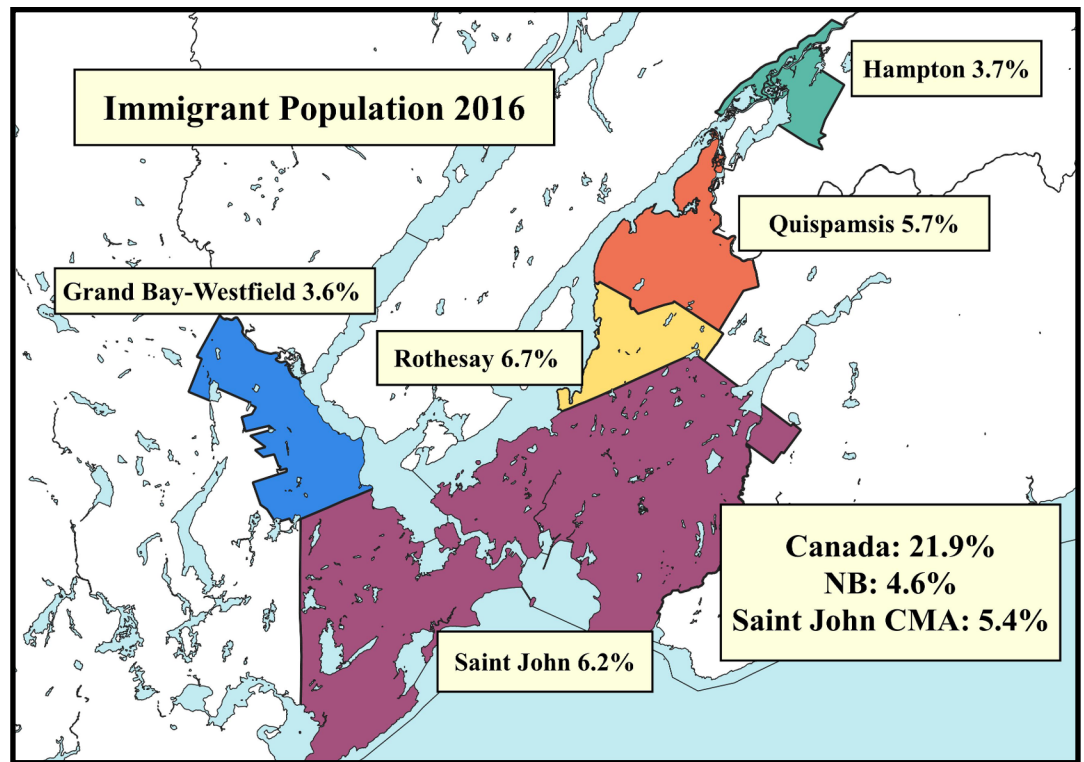


Who is an "Immigrant"?

## Visible Minority Population (%)

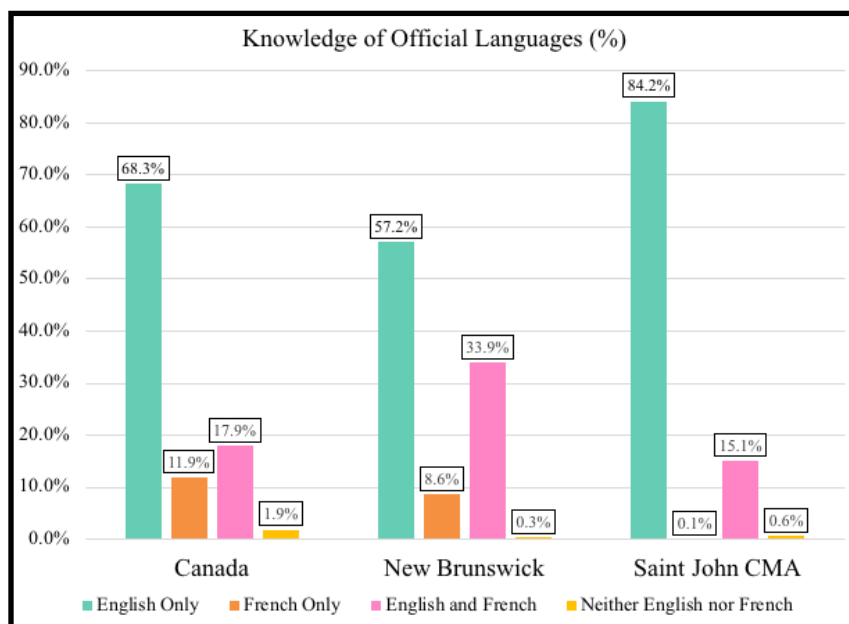

## Languages in the CMA

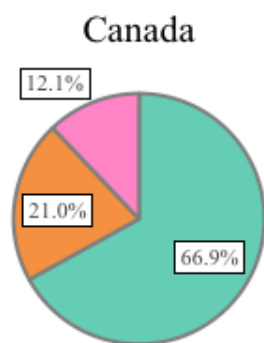

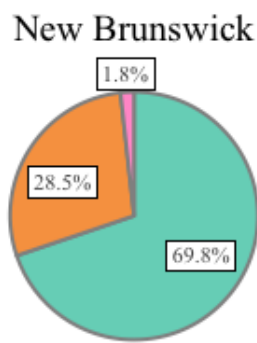

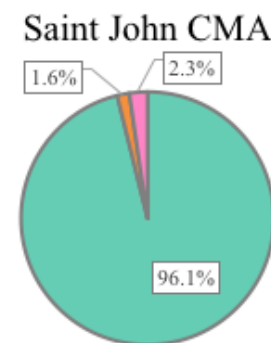
## Language most often spoken at home
