



# Who is considered NEET?

According to Statistics
Canada, a young person
who is not in education,
employment, or training
can be classified in the
NEET group.\* This
includes anyone who is
unemployed or not in
the labour force and is
not attending school.

The **City of Saint John** has the highest percentage of youth (15-24 years) in the NEET group in the CMA.


**1,105** out of the city's **7,785** youth **(14.3%)** are NEET.


### NEET Youth (15 - 19)

Young people who are not in education or employment may be experiencing difficulties making the transition from school to the labour market and could also be at a higher risk of social exclusion and depression.\* NEET youth between the ages of 15 and 19 may have a particulary hard time transitioning to the labour market as they have not had as much time to develop skills and gain working experience.

Of the three largest population centres in the CMA, the city of Saint John has the highest percentage and greatest number of young people between the ages of 15 and 19 who are NEET.
