What is an NOC Code?

National Occupational Classification (NOC) is how Statistics Canada and Employment and Social Development Canada classify jobs. The NOC is a 4-digit hierarchical code which uniquely identifies occupations in Canada. The 2016 Census uses the first digit to classify occupations into 10 broad categories.



0	Management occupations	9.3%	\$ 62,452

More than 1 in 4 employees in the CMA is classified under NOC code 6 - sales and service occupations.* These include customer and information services representatives, cashiers, retail sales people, and technical sales people.** Occupations that fall into this broad category have a median employment income of \$18,552, which is the second lowest out of the 10 broad categories.

Occupations by Sex


