

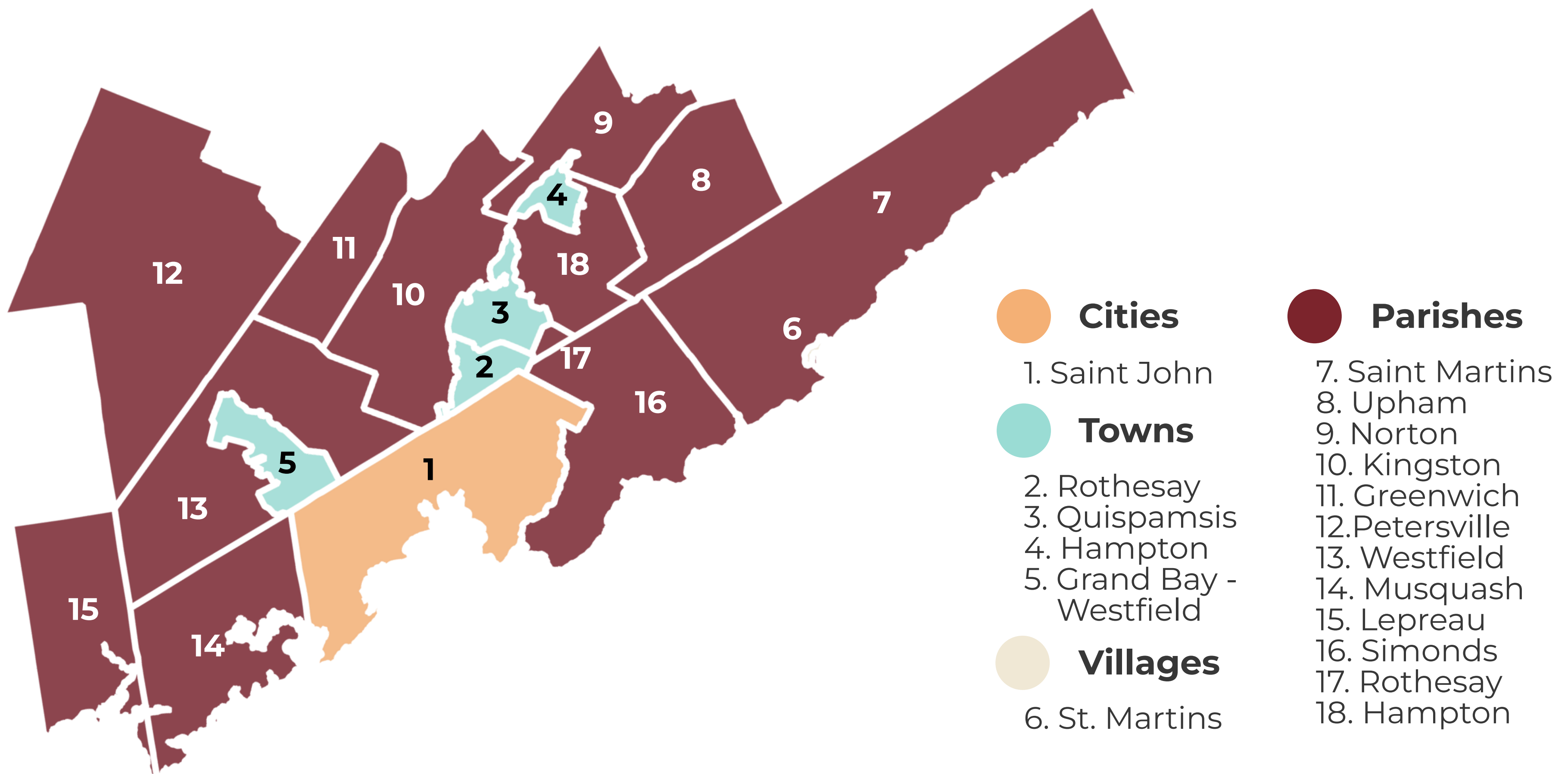

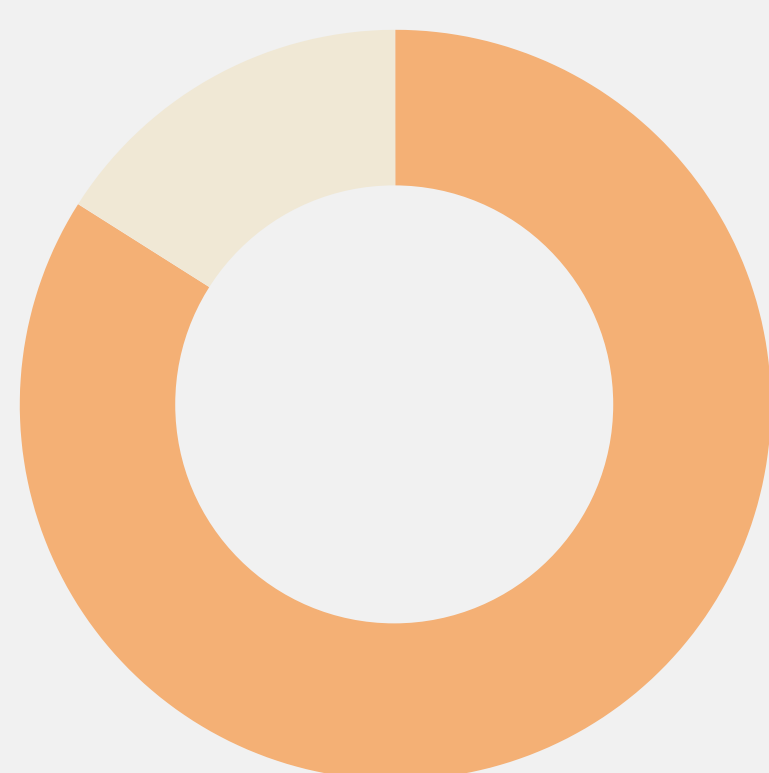
### Census Metropolitan Area Population

What is a Census Metropolitan Area?

A Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) is formed by one or more municipalities surrounding a population center (known as the core - in this case the city of Saint John). A CMA has a total population of at least 100,000 residents; 50,000 or more must live in the core.

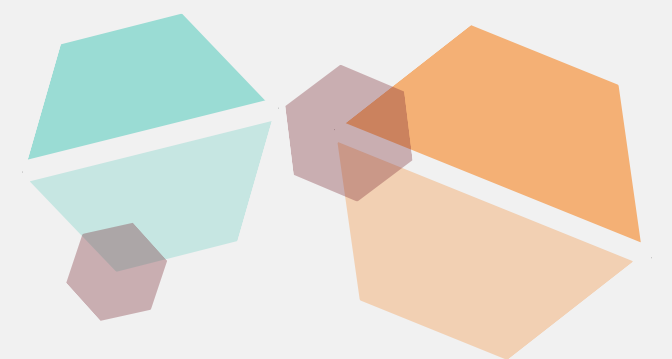


Saint John plus the towns of Rothesay, Quispamsis, Grand Bay - Westfield and Hampton make up
